Hopewell seemingly was quite healthy in 1784-5. Dr Christian Baum, for whom Baumstown, opposite Birdsboro on the Philadelphia Pike, is named,

earned only 1 Pound and 15 shillings treating three Hopewell families in

January 1785. This amounted to about \$4.61. Laborer Hawn Rice paid 16/9, teamster
about 1.43 *Peter*

teamster Wm Waistner/and ~~one of the Rices~~ 5 shillings, abt .65 NATURALLY

No other doctor is in the Record; but some self-administered medicine is sold.
