

COLLIER WM O HAY (p 40, 129) "FULLTIME"

Owmed a horse since he bought 1 1/4 bushels of horse feed before he purchased a cow for 4.5.0, abt \$11.29. He also paid a tax of 4S 2 P, abt .54, However, The purchase of 1/2 bu potatoes in May suggested exhasutin of own. he had no shoeing charged at the Smith Shop./He purchased about 8 pounds of tobacco, making him a heavier than usual user of the weed.

That he was married if proven by a cash payment collected by his wife, one of four totalling 15.5, ~~abxx~~ less than \$2.66. He charged no tailoring and bought only 4 yards of linen. However, he did make ~~fxm~~ three purchases / from John G.ay, nearby merchant. abt \$3.30

Meatwise, he bought 21 1/2 pounds of bacon(mark of a collier), 190 3/4 of pork and 195 1/2 of beef. This averaged over 1.1. pounds daily for the entire year of 17 84. His flour purchases, 56 1/2 quarters(28#) ~~fx~~ includes white flour

42 of rye and 196# of cornmeal. This bread source averaged 4.32 pounds-Loaves daily for the entire year also, suggesting children in the family. O Hay also liked mackeral, purchasinf 6, 7 and 8 at a time, and totaling 49, almost one a week. He also bought a cow, ~~for~~ but whether for milk of butchering is

unknown. The buying of a barrèl and 17 quart of salt and 30 3/4 pounds of beef suggests corned beef. He also bought the OFFAL from a Hopewell beef butchering for 4.6, about .56. For this amount he received the head(tongue and brains), tallow, heart, liver, kidneys, stomach (tripe) and tail. As a woodcutter or collier out in the woods, he ~~understandingly~~ bot a soxket edge and a blanket. His dutch oven may have gone into his home.

His income came from the cutting of 82 1/2 cords of wood @ 2/3 9.7.6 at 3 cords daily, about 27 days of work.

As a collier for 6 m 17 days @ 4.7.6(abt \$11.61 a mo) 36.14.5

His devt to Bird was 14.14.6 1/2 (less than 39.90 Total 46.1.11 of this was a LATE credit from Bird. ~~fx~~ (\$23.44)
